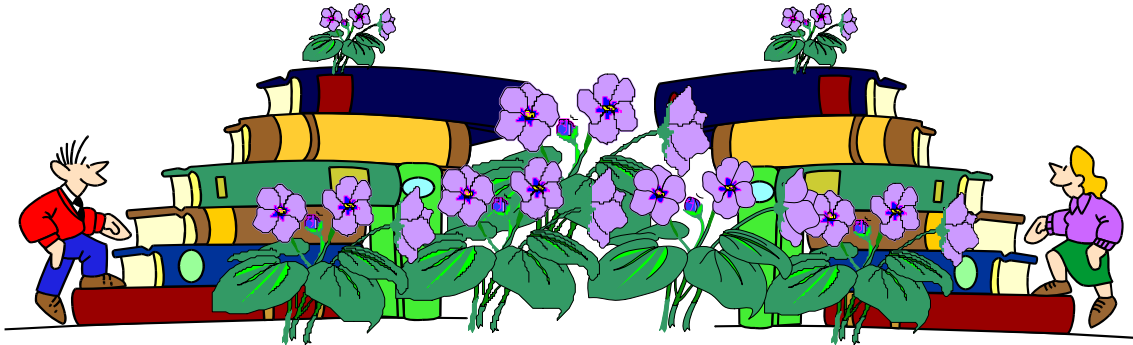

Lots of unusual varieties of African violets on display and for sale from miniatures to trailers to plants measuring over a foot in diameter. Most of these plants are hybrids not available for sale locally. Pinks, whites and lavenders to darker violets and reds — plus the rarer greens. Solid blossoms, spotted, or "fantasy" blossoms, striped blossoms. Blossoms as small as a quarter-inch wide to ones over two inches wide! Quilted leaves, variegated leaves, ruffled leaves — a feast for the eyes! Other gesneriad varieties (the African violet's cousins) will also be displayed and available for sale.

Fresh-cut leaves for propagation will also be for sale. And, don't miss the "How To" educational section focusing on repotting and grooming your violets, spotting problems, propagating leaves. You are welcome to bring in an ailing violet of your own to the show or receive help in repotting and grooming one you purchase there!
